// ABOUT THE AGBI

Our History

The AGBI was founded in 1814 by members of the Royal Academy of Arts including J.M.W. Turner, John Constable and John Soane and was incorporated by Royal Charter in 1842. It is one of the oldest charities in the United Kingdom.

Our Purpose

The AGBI provides financial support to professional artists in need and their dependents living in England, Wales and Northern Ireland who cannot work or earn due to personal accident, illness or older age.

Our Vision

The AGBI should be at the centre of the artistic community. The AGBI should be the benevolent fund that all professional artists support and from which professional artists in need receive support. The AGBI should be supported by all other elements of the artistic community.

Our Values

We are an artist-led benevolent fund and our values underline our commitment to our applicants, staff, members and donors.

The AGBI core values are those below:

- · Being independent and artist-led at all times.
- Possessing a generosity of spirit towards potential and current applicants.
- Being professional in our approach to our work, acting with integrity and compassion.
- Being compliant with high governance standards.
- · Taking care of our donations and using our resources effectively.
- Respecting diversity, confidentiality and treating people with respect.
- Providing our assistance in a person-centred timely fashion.

// ABOUT THE AGBI

Who do we help?

Any professional artist no matter what their medium can apply for help if they have earned their living or a significant part of it from art. We support artists who work with installation, sound and video as well as sculptors and painters. Surviving partners in need and orphaned children of artists are also eligible to apply.

Eligibility Criteria

The AGBI looks at the training, qualifications, details of exhibitions, art-based employment and the number of years an applicant has made a living from art. The AGBI is also presented with original examples of an applicant's work, sketchbooks and catalogues, and recent letters from an applicant's GP or consultant confirming their medical circumstances.

How we help

Support from the AGBI is given in the form of a grant for a period of one year. Sometimes this is all that is needed, but help can be longer term depending on the situation of the applicant. For those long-term cases, the circumstances are reviewed annually by the Artists Council which meets regularly and discusses each case and agrees on the level of financial help an applicant should receive in the coming year. The Artists Council receives guidance where appropriate from the AGBI's Medical Advisor.

With great sadness the AGBI shares the news that Ken Howard died on 11th September 2022. Ken served on the AGBI Artists Council from 2009 until 2017, he was passionate about helping artists in need.

His generosity and contribution to our charitable objectives was greatly appreciated by the Trustees, members of the Artists Council and the staff of the AGBI.



// OUR IMPACT IN 21/22

In the financial year 2021 - 2022 the AGBI supported a total of 84 artists and their dependents in need.

The Artists Council assessed each artist on a case-by-case basis using a set of eligibility guidelines and agreed on total funding commitments of £270,473.

Of the 84 artists supported, 7 were new cases, 56 were artists needing continued support, 7 distinguished artists received the AGBI Jubilee Award and 14 children of artists were supported by the AGBI Children's Fund.

// CASE STUDIES

Martin's Story

Martin is a landscape painter who lives and works in Cornwall. His work has been exhibited and sold through established professional galleries in central London.

The AGBI has supported Martin for several years since he was diagnosed with cancer and chronic depression. His physical and mental health issues have significantly affected his wellbeing. Martin was once a prolific painter but has struggled to paint since his diagnosis.

He was referred to the AGBI by a fellow painter who was concerned about Martin's declining mental health following several operations and chemotherapy.

During the application process it became clear that Martin would benefit greatly from a short respite break, so in discussion with Martin a week-long respite break to Scotland was organised and funded by the AGBI.

The AGBI also recommended help be given to replenish his art materials so he could paint the Scottish landscapes during his respite break.

// CASE STUDY

Veronica's Story

Veronica is a contemporary sculptor who lives and works in London. Her partner died in 2020 leaving Veronica to bring up their young daughters on her own.

She is a commercially successful artist but struggled as a single parent to maintain her career and bring up two young children since her partner's death. The pressures on Veronica were considerable and she was not coping without the help of her partner.

There were not enough hours in the day to go to the studio, drop off and collect her daughters from school and manage the home, so her practice began to suffer.

The AGBI Children's Fund, which helps children who have lost the support of one or both parents, approved an application to help Veronica and her daughters with funding for additional child care after school to enable Veronica more time in her studio during the week. Our help has made an enormous difference to this young family which was experiencing difficult times.




