# **ABOUT THE AGBI**

The AGBI is an artist-led benevolent fund supporting professional visual artists in need who are unable to work due to injury or illness. The AGBI Children's Fund supports the children of professional visual artists who have lost the support of one or both parents.

#### **OUR HISTORY**

The AGBI was founded in 1814 by members of the Royal Academy of Arts including J.M.W. Turner, John Constable and John Soane and was incorporated by Royal Charter in 1842. It is one of the oldest charities in the United Kingdom.

#### **OUR PURPOSE**

The AGBI provides financial support to visual artists and their dependents in need who live in England, Wales or Northern Ireland and who cannot work or earn due to injury or illness.

#### **OUR VISION**

The AGBI is the benevolent fund that is supported by all visual artists and from which visual artists and their dependents in need can receive support.

# **ABOUT THE AGBI**

#### **OUR VALUES**

The AGBI is an artist-led benevolent fund. Our values underline our commitment to our applicants, donors, staff, and members. We outline the following as our core values:

#### Artist-led

Visual artists are at the centre of all that we do. The AGBI operates with a unique understanding of the complex challenges faced by visual artists in need. Being artist-led means drawing from the breadth of knowledge and artist's perspectives of our Trustees and Artists Council. We develop programmes specifically for visual artists and believe that the power to make positive change exists within our community.

#### Discretion and Integrity

AGBI staff, Trustees and Committee Members operate with discretion and integrity. We provide confidential support and do not disclose details of who, why or how we have supported applicants. Upholding these values gives our applicants the confidence they need when asking for support.

#### Agency

We uphold the agency of the visual artists who apply and support them through difficult times with grant giving, medical consultations, information and peer-to-peer support sessions. We believe it is important for visual artists to maintain autonomy over their lives and our support helps them to help themselves. We do not provide instruction or conditions to our applicants.

#### Person-centred

Our applicants face challenges unique to themselves, and no two applicants are the same. The AGBI operates with openness and empathy for every individual circumstance that is shared with us. We take time to listen to our applicants, we do not judge any applicant and we communicate with authenticity, empathy and kindness. We recognise our responsibility to create a safe environment for sharing to take place and for trust to build. We are privileged to hear the artist's life stories which they choose to share with the AGBI.

#### **Inclusivity and Diversity**

We support visual artists regardless of their background or their identities. We recognise the existing structures within the art world that are tied to specific identities and how they act as barriers to marginalised groups. We are changing how we learn and how we raise our awareness with under-represented groups to support all visual artists in need who meet our criteria.

# **ABOUT THE AGBI**

#### WHO DO WE SUPPORT

The AGBI is the only benevolent fund in the UK specifically supporting visual artists in times of need. Our grants are awarded to visual artists who earn their living, or major part of their living, from art and live in England, Wales or Northern Ireland. Visual artists, no matter what their medium, can apply for a grant from the AGBI. Surviving partners of visual artists are also eligible to apply. The AGBI Children's Fund supports the children of visual artists who remain in education, are under the age of 25 and who have lost the support or one or both parents.

#### **HOW DO WE HELP**

AGBI support is confidential. Grants are awarded for a period of one year and this can be all that is needed to get an artist back working in their studio. Depending on the applicant's situation, help can be for a longer term. For these longer-term cases, the circumstances are reviewed annually by the AGBI's Artists Council and Medical Advisor. The Artists Council meets regularly to discuss each case and agree the level of financial help that the AGBI can provide.


#### **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

The Artists Council looks at the training, qualifications, details of exhibitions and art-based employment and the career of the applicant. The Artists Council is presented with original examples of an applicant's work and, where relevant, recent letters from the applicant's GP or NHS consultant confirming their medical circumstances.

#### **HOW TO APPLY**

Visual artists in need, surviving partners of visual artists and children of visual artists can apply at any time. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis and reviewed by our Artists Council. Potential applicants are visited by the Secretary of the AGBI.

# **CASE STUDY**

Our AGBI Children's Fund supports the children of visual artists who remain in education, are under the age of 25 and who have lost the support of one of both parents.

Honor is 19 years old and she has been supported by our Children's Fund since her mother died in 2015.

Her mother was a sculptor who lived and worked in Cornwall. The AGBI supported Honor's mother for several years whilst she was unable to work during her illness. When she died, our financial support transferred to Honor to help with her school and then her college expenses.

Honor comes from a family of visual artists; her grandfather was a painter who taught at Camberwell College of Arts. Honor had always wanted to be a painter and attend one of the leading London art schools. But without the financial support of her mother, leaving Cornwall and studying in London was looking increasingly difficult due to the higher living costs. Once all the available student loans had been successfully awarded Honor still had a funding shortfall and needed our support.

Honor came to meet the AGBI team to discuss her situation and complete an application form to apply for funding. The Children's Fund Committee agreed to award Honor a monthly grant of £500 to support her art materials and living costs whilst she remains at art school. Our grants have made a significant difference to Honor's situation who wrote to say:

"I would like to say a massive thank you to the AGBI for offering this funding to people like me from less fortunate backgrounds and in difficult situations. It has made such a huge difference and allowed me to study and explore different artists' techniques and processes. I love my course and I am looking forward to a career as an artist, it's all I ever wanted."

The personal details in this case study have been changed to protect the identity of our applicants.


